Dangerous Goods Awareness

Who is this course for?

The Dangerous Goods Awareness course is intended for anyone working in the transport, warehousing, distribution and storage industries who may handle dangerous goods and/or hazardous substances.

The course is designed to meet workplace training obligations relating to Division 3, Clause 22 of the Australian Dangerous Goods Code (Seventh Edition).

Licensing, Legislative, Regulatory Considerations

According to the Australian Code for the Transport of Dangerous Goods (7th Edition), **anyone** involved in the **packing, storage and transport** of dangerous goods is required, by law, to have received **appropriate instruction** and training prior to carrying out any related tasks.

An employer of such a person is responsible for supplying this instruction and training, or at least, providing enough supervision by a person who has received appropriate instruction and training in performing the tasks, to ensure that the tasks performed are carried out safely.

About the course

The course provides knowledge of the Australian Code for the Transport of Dangerous Goods (7th Edition) and the responsibilities associated with the storage and handling of dangerous goods.

On successful completion participants will receive a Nationally Recognised Statement of Attainment.

The course covers the requirements to transport dangerous goods in accordance with the Australian Dangerous Goods Code (Edition 7), including the following:

- Classes of dangerous goods
- Marking and labelling
- Transport provisions
- Documentation
- Vehicle Placarding
- Safety Requirements
- Bulk transfer of dangerous goods
- Segregation

Course Duration

This training program is approximately 6 - 8 hours depending on an individual's prior knowledge of the industry and learning needs.

Course Cost

Communication	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Workers are required to communicate clearly and directly with internal and external clients and have an understanding of their needs. They must be capable of reading and understanding dangerous goods information and have suitable numeracy skills to undertake calculations relating to loads. This information is required to be shared with authorised personnel in the workplace.
Teamwork	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Work both as an individual and within a team environment to support fellow employees in a coaching or mentoring role.
Problem solving	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Need to analyse and problem solve when dealing with a range of changing conditions and work environments while using mathematical skills to determine load capacities.
Initiative and enterprise	<ul style="list-style-type: none">An ability to adapt to changing situations and workload and develop ideas that will be put into action to benefit work colleagues and the public.
Planning and organising	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Requirement to be autonomous adjust self and workplace environment to fit the need of internal and external clients and to use resources effectively and efficiently whilst analysing and managing risk achieving expected workplace outcomes.
Self management	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Workers are required to take responsibility for the loading/transfer of loads and their transport on the public roads.
Learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Workers are required to further their learning to contribute to the workplace and their own skills by maintaining currency with legislation, standards and dangerous goods products.
Technology	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Persons involved with Dangerous Goods are required to have occupational health and safety knowledge that applies to changing technology in transfer and transport of dangerous goods.
